

Supplement to the General Examination Regulations of the TÜV SÜD Examination Institute Special conditions for “Scrum – TÜV” examination

1 Scope

For all tests in the area of project management through the TÜV SÜD Examination Institute, the following amendments apply in addition to the General Examination Regulations of the TÜV SÜD Examination Institute.

2 Examination procedure and evaluation

(1) Admission requirements:

Scrum Master – TÜV / Scrum Product Owner – TÜV

Scrum training with an approved training partner is recommended.

If the participant has not attended any training before, the participant assures that he/she is familiar with the syllabus ([Guide Scrum - TÜV](#)) and confirms that he/she has acquired this content in advance through training or self-study.

If the participant has not attended any training, he must submit the following self-declaration as a prerequisite for participation in the examination:

"I hereby certify that I am familiar with the syllabus (Guide Scrum - TÜV) and confirm that I have acquired the contents of the syllabus through training courses or self-study."

(2) Procedure:

In the written exam, questions are asked on the relevant subject areas of the learning objectives underlying the exam. This is done by the following procedures:

Multiple choice questions: There are several possible answers for each question. One or more answers may be correct (complex multiple choice). Grading is done on a point system. Each correct answer earns a plus point and each wrong answer gets a minus. Missing (unmarked) answers get zero points. The lowest number of points for a given question is zero.

(3) Duration: The duration of each exam can be found in the table in Section 5.

(4) Number of test questions: The number of questions on each exam can be found in the table in Section 5.

(5) Permitted resources: Either no resources (closed-book exam) or permitted resources (open-book exam) can be used. The table in Section 5 shows whether the exam is open-book or closed-book.

In regard to all other aspects, Section 9 of the General Examination Regulations of the TÜV SÜD Examination Institute applies.

(6) Minimum to pass: Passing the exam requires a specified percentage of the maximum possible points. This is shown by exam part in the table in Section 5.

(7) If a participant passes the exam, they get a personal certificate. If the participant does not pass, they get a results confirmation showing that they took the exam.

(8) Exam participants with special needs: Exam participants who have special needs or limitations must communicate this to the examiner before the exam begins. The decision on whether and what measures are taken lies with the examiner. The examiner must document the decision. Exam participants have no general right to accommodation measures.

3 Miscellaneous

The provisions of these special conditions take precedence over the provisions of the General Examination Regulations of the TÜV SÜD Examination Institute. Otherwise, the provisions of the General Examination Regulations of the TÜV SÜD Examination Institute apply unchanged. 4 Repeating exams

- (1) The exam can be repeated no more than twice within 12 months.
- (2) The repetition shall be made with recourse to the available dates.
